BEGINNING GUITAR

Rising 3rd-8th Weeks 1, 2, 3, 4

Everyone wants to play the guitar, and now you can! Campers will learn to read music, play simple melodies, and learn to strum their very first acoustic chords! Your camper will need a nylon or steel string acoustic guitar in order to participate. GUITAR II Instructor: Charles Horel Weeks 1, 2, 3, 4 Prerequisites: Beginning Guitar (offered weeks 1, 2, 3, 4), some previous guitar instruction, or at least 6 months of self study.

Expand your knowledge of the fretboard by learning more advanced chord shapes including moveable chords, moveable pentatonic, diatonic, and blues scale patterns. Gain exposure to a wider range of accompaniment and solo guitar styles including fingerstyle and flatpicking. Bring an acoustic or classical guitar.

Explore painting techniques with watercolor and acrylic paint while learning to mix colors and compose interesting compositions from still lifes, figures, plein air painting, and abstraction. Learn to think like a painter as you compose your subjects, experiment with applying paint to canvas and paper, and critique your work with classmates.

Campers we will explore all the beautiful and functional possibilities of paper. They will cut it, fold it, wet it, mold it, and make striking art.

JEWELRY-BEADS 101

Learn how to combine colors together and create beautiful jewelry. Students will learn basic wire wrapping, construction of links, and clasps.

JEWELRY-BEADS 102

A more advanced class for students with some beading exposure. Campers will explore the peyote stitch and embroidery techniques on fabric, and incorporate all of their designs into wearable jewelry.



CLAYING AROUND 101

Learn the basic hand-building techniques of slab building, coiling, and pinch pot to create your own works of art!

CLAYING AROUND 102

Rising 6th–8th Weeks 1, 2, 3, 4

Learn to work with clay to create both functional and sculptural forms. Hand-building techniques (slab, coil, drape, and pinch) and wheelwork will be introduced as students learn to follow the creation of ceramic art from greenware through the glazing and firing processes.

DRAWING

It all starts here! Campers will learn the foundation that all artists need to create art. Among learning the traditional skills of composition, perspective, proportion, and line, they will also explore the practice of journaling. Keeping a journal helps artists to record their creative thoughts and plan their artistic ideas.



JEWELRY-ENAMELING 101

Add beautiful colors to your handmade jewelry. Students will learn basic enameling methods with transparent and opaque powders, dry sifting, stenciling, and scraffito. Enameling is a more technical experience in jewelry construction that will impress your friends and family!

Campers will explore more advanced techniques including painting enamels and cloisonné. After constructing their masterpieces, they will turn them into wearable art!
